In lieu of flowers memorial contributions can be made to the Caroline County Humane Society, 407 West Bell Street, Ridgely, MD 21660.



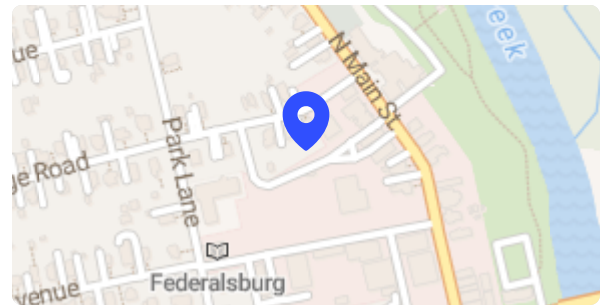

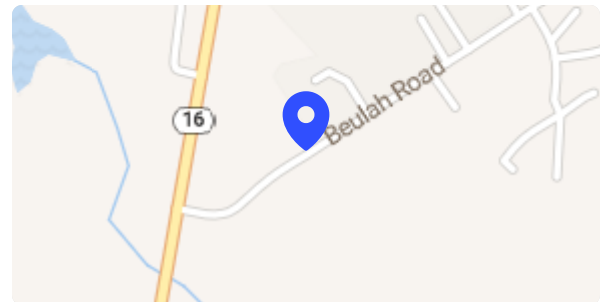
