Raymond Benoni Butler of Harmony, MD passed away on Friday, December 7, 2007 at Caroline Home for Hospice in Denton. He was 86.

He was born on October 26, 1921 in Easton, Maryland son of the late Floyd Sheldon Butler and Edith Bell Chaplain Butler.

He entered the National Guard and continued his military service in the United States Army during World War II.
