Nancy M. Prouse of Federalsburg, MD passed away on Monday, Dec. 31, 2007 at William Hill Manor in Easton, MD. She was 85 years old.

She was born Oct. 3, 1922 in Chester, PA, the daughter of the late Dufferin and Katherine Kingan McConnell. Her husband, William Donald Prouse preceded her in death.

She worked at the original Federalsburg High School as secretary for over 20 years with the 1961 School Year Book being dedicated to her service. She continued working as secretary for the Caroline Board of Education retiring after 25 years of service. She was a member of the Union United Methodist Church and was also a member of Order of the Eastern Star Caroline Chapter #62.
